

Announcing A Special Issue of Landscape Journal

"NATURE, FORM, MEANING"

Fall 1988

"We are surrounded with things which we have not made and which have a life and structure different from our own: trees, flowers, grasses, rivers, hills, clouds. For centuries they have inspired us with curiosity and awe. They have been objects of delight. We have recreated them in our imaginations to reflect our moods. And we have come to think of them as contributing to an idea which we have called nature" (Kenneth Clark, Landscape Into Art). Landscape design expresses our conception of Nature and our view of one's place in nature. This issue of Nature is therefore fundamental to landscape design theory.

Landscape Journal will publish a special double issue in Fall 1988 on landscape design theory that will focus on the theme of "Nature, Form, and Meaning." The special issue will consist of approximately twelve articles and an introductory essay. Half the articles will be invited; of these one-half will be from leading theorists in such fields as art history, philosophy, and geography. The remaining six articles will be selected from those submitted in response to a Call for Papers.

Potential contributors are encouraged to interpret the topic broadly, within the overall frame of landscape design theory. Papers and accompanying illustrations are due July 15, 1987. (See Landscape Journal, Guidelines for Submissions). The Journal hopes to include a small number of colored graphics if budget permits. Papers should be sent to:


