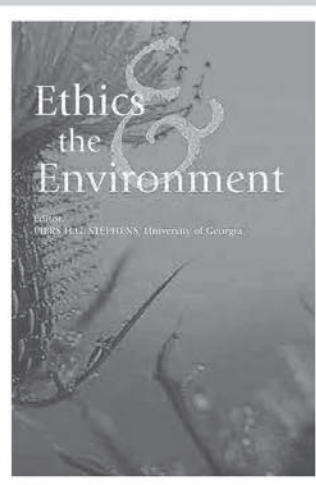


Ethics & the Environment

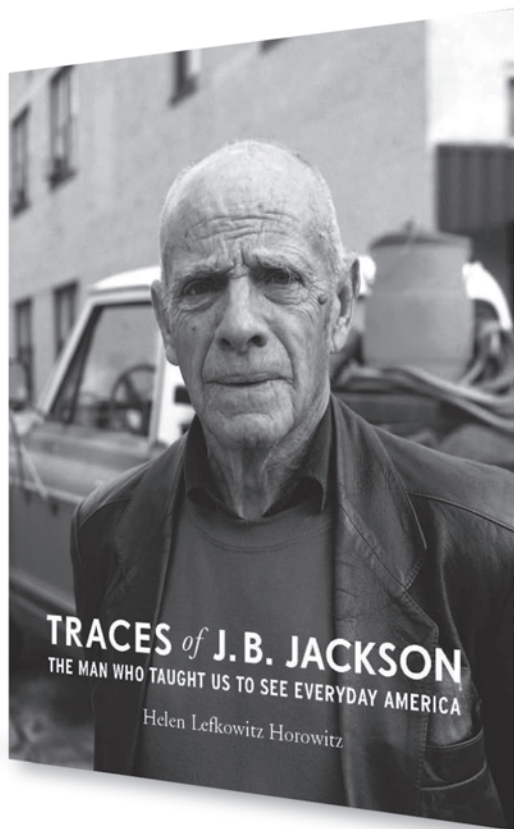

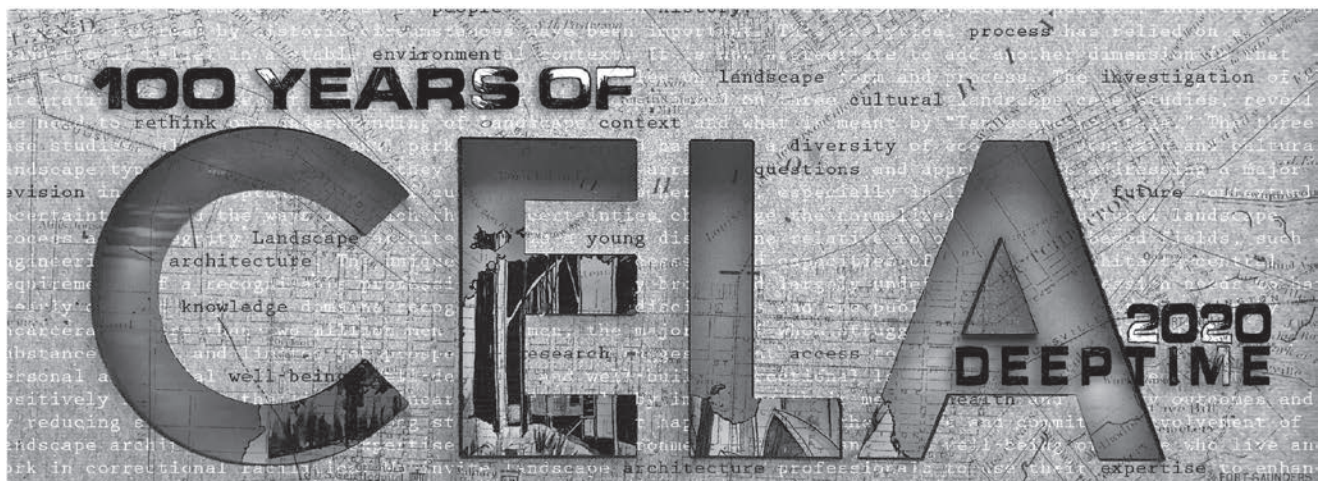

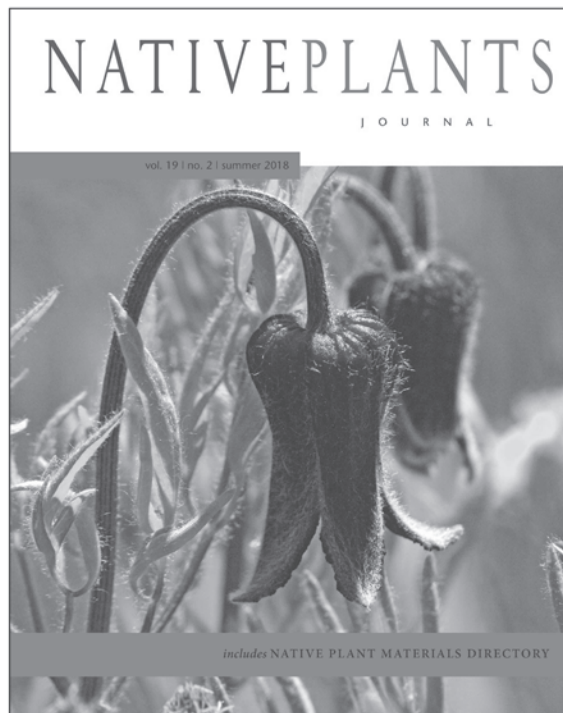
